BMW Club WA (Inc)

Code of Conduct

BMW Club WA (Inc) has a Code of Conduct that are guidelines setting out how members of our Club are expected to behave, so that the club is always promoted as a responsible organisation.

Members are reminded that if you bring guests to our events (which you are always welcome to do), those guests are perceived by the public to be Club Members, and are therefore expected to behave as such.

This Code provides a framework within which Members of the Club (and their guests) are responsible for observing its embedded principles when participating in events under the Club's banner.

As a basic Club policy, BMW Club WA (Inc) is a law-abiding association and expects its Members and their guests to behave in a law-abiding manner at all times when participating in Club events.

All drivers of vehicles to, from and during an official BMW Club WA event must hold a current and appropriate driver's licence to drive that vehicle, and that vehicle must itself be appropriately licensed while on any and all public roads that must be traversed when travelling to, from and during the Club event.

The licensed status of the driver and the vehicle in use at a Club event such as a driver training day, a track day or a competitive timed event, which is held on private roads or specially closed public roads, will be required to comply with the requirements imposed by the event organiser and/or the venue owner while the vehicle and driver are on those roads.

Under this Code, Members and their guests will:

- extend to any person with whom they have contact the socially accepted Australian code of etiquette and conduct
- represent the Club with a favourable reflection at all times, and consider all actions to ensure no detriment to the Club or its reputation
- respect the rights, dignity, and worth of every person with whom they have contact regardless of age, gender, ethnic origin, or ability and refrain from any discriminatory practices based on age, gender, sexual orientation, religion, ethnic origin, or ability
- accept responsibility for their actions, and display high standards in language, conduct, punctuality, and presentation
- operate within the Rules and spirit of the Club, abide by the Rules of the Club, and respect the individuals administering the Rules
- refrain from any form of verbal, physical, or emotional abuse toward other Members or any other person with whom they have contact
- not undertake any activity in the name of the Club without consideration and approval of the Club Committee
- maintain a balanced viewpoint on all situations, and ensure adherence to all legal, road safety and social rules
- be a positive role model for other Members and any other person with whom they have contact.

Any breach of this Code could result in a review of the individual's Membership, the suspension or withdrawal of which could result after consultation with and consensus by the Club Committee, and in accordance with the Club's Rules.

The Rules of BMW Club WA (Inc) are those described in its currently registered Constitution.
